Does your wireless mouse battery have a short life?

If you use a wireless mouse on a desk PC and get 'battery low' messages because the receiver is plugged into a USB port at the back of the PC, get a USB extension cable and plug the mouse receiver into the outboard end of it. Place that end in sight of the mouse and the battery will last a long time. Ours has been running for several weeks on one AA cell and it's left turned on most nights. It's not an LED type. Microsoft model 1054, in this example, which also has the magnifier feature for small type and elder-eyes; just push a small button on the left side and put the cursor over the area you want to enlarge. Then you can move it around to handle a whole doc.

**General Membership Meeting
Friday, September 9, 2007**

The meeting was called to order by president Denice Stoops at 19:32 hrs. Twenty three members were in attendance.

Secretary Randy Jenkins reported on incoming communications from Zero Breast Cancer. Dave Hodgson commented on a letter from the State of California, that had been found in the mailbox in front of the building and was a year old. Dave suggested that we need to check the mailbox more frequently.

President Denice Stoops reported on the actions of the Board of Directors meetings on August 9 and August 27. The meeting on August 9 included a session with the contractor doing the remodeling work. The special meeting on August 27 was called to discuss the status of the remodeling work, and resulted in a vote to dismiss the contractor.

Treasurer Dave Hodgson reported August income of \$2200.00 and expenses of \$871.94.

Committee Reports:

Public Service: Randy Jenkins reported on the upcoming Escape from Alcatraz on September 29, and the request for assistance with Waves to Wine on September 29 and 30.

Technical: Dave Hodgson reported that there had been a problem with the 147.33 machine that had resolved itself, and that we were still in question as to the effect of the DOD complaints about interference in the 70 cm band to the Pave Paws radar system in Marysville.

Education: Ben Sawtelle discussed the new format for presenting the Technician Class license, which was a PowerPoint based instructional system. Dave Hodgson reported that the class for the Tam Valley CERT group had just concluded, and a special VE session was being scheduled for September 30. VE Coordinator: Randy Jenkins commented on the VE session scheduled for September 30.

Field Day: Rich Carbine confirmed that the reservation to use the Marin Rod and Gun Club for Field Day 2008 was all set.

The meeting was called to order at 19:29 hrs by president Denice Stoops. Secretary: The minutes of the August 9 board meeting and the August 27 special board meeting were approved as e-mailed. Communications: Jenkins reported that a thank you postcard was received from the Holstein Hundred. Treasurer: Dave Hodgson submitted his monthly report. It was approved by the Board of Directors. Committee reports: Membership: A report was received on the passing of Chuck Deatruck WA6SQQ. Recreation: The picnic is coming up on Saturday, September 15. The Christmas party will be scheduled for December 2. Preferences for the menu need to be received by November 1. Reservations need to be received by November 15.
